April 18, 2022

Council met in regular session with Mayor Joshua Elliott presiding. Roll call was taken, and the following members were present: Davis, Ranes, Butts, Patterson, Rains, Ellison, Wood and A. Elliott. City Administrator, City Clerk and Chief of Police were present along with several guests.

1. EPA Presentation: Kim Burr gave an update on the lead situation in Caney. Advised they will be doing a virtual presentation on May 12th to discuss the next steps they will be taking to continue the cleanup in Caney.

- 2. Kansas Rural Housing Incentive District Program: Tom Simpson and April Nutt gave a presentation on how the Housing Incentive Program works. Gave examples of how the City of Independence is utilizing the program. No Action Taken

- 4. Mowing Contract for Cemetery: New contract price for Phillip Sweeney to continue mowing is \$2,310.00 which is a \$60.00 increase from last season. Motion made by Ellison; seconded by A. Elliott to approve. 8-0 Motion Carried
 - 5. Skid Unit Quotes for Fire Department:

Motion was made by Ellison; seconded by Wood to approve the purchase the 265-gallon tank thru Feld Fire for \$12,067.00 plus the additional \$915.00 if needed. 8-0 Motion Carried

- 6. Upgrade Cox Internet Service: After reviewing the proposal from Cox the mayor wanted to check into further before making a decision. Tabled until next meeting.
- 7. Request to Place Lifepak 15 as Surplus: The city's EMS department received a grant from the State of Kansas to replace medical equipment. The amount of the grant is for \$22,905.68 and it's a 75/25 match. The city's portion will be \$2,316.55 if the company they are purchasing the equipment from can purchase the old Lifepak 15 for \$6,500.00. Motion was made by Ellison; seconded by Rains to put the Lifepak 15 in as surplus. 8-0 Motion Carried
- 8. Request to Install Street Light on E. 3rd: Request was made due to the lighting situation on the portion of 3rd Street. There have been several accidents with people backing out of their driveways at night and hitting parked cars. Motion was made by Ellison; seconded by A. Elliott to approve request. 8-0 Motion Carried
- 9. Purchase New Air Compressor for Water Plant: Need to purchase a bigger air compressor for the water plant so that if the current on goes down the new one will help keep the plant operating. Cost of new one is \$13,124.00 which includes installation. Motion made by Patterson; seconded by Butts to approve purchase. 8-0 Motion Carried
- 10. Apprenticeship Program: KRWA offers this program for the wastewater plant operator. It's a two-year program and KRWA pays for cost of training. The cost to the city is the pay increases to the employee as they finish certain phases of the training. Motion made by Ellison; seconded by Patterson to enroll Matt Childers in the program. 8-0 Motion Carried

 - Discussed condemnation of property on N. State. Motion was made by Patterson; seconded by A. Elliott to approve resolution to set hearing date. 8-0 Motion Carried
